

# The BoatLogger ecosystem

## **▶** The System



The center of the BoatLogger system is the website. The site stores and shares all information, but there are several ways of communicating with the website.

- Smartphone Apps. Special developed apps collect information and store it in the logbook. The apps become your easy at hand on-board logbook. The apps automatically record the boat's positions via its build in GPS and allow the user to enter log book entries about what happens on board or quickly take photos, which are stored in the logbook.
- **GPS Loggers.** It is nowadays common to install GPS trackers in the boats. These contain a GPS receiver that records the boat's position. The positions are then send via either 3G or satellite to the BoatLogger server.
- Online Interface. All information is seen and can be changed via the web browser.
- Boat Supervisor. This is a special electronic device which supervises the boat day and night weather you are on board or not. When on a journey it interfaces via NMEA2000, NMEA183 or Seatalk to your on board instruments to log what it is happening. When not on a journey it still records things like tank levels, battery conditions and charging, temperature, humidity in the boat etc.
- Social Media Integration. Many users already have a Facebook, Twitter, Flickr or blog account. The BoatLogger.com site can automatically link up with those sites and exchange information.
- API Programming Interface. A programming interface available to connect any program you want to your site and get or update information. The API can be also used by third party developers who freely develops apps that integrate with BoatLogger.com.
- Data Panes. Areas on your website showing or retrieving information about anything from the logbook to weather forecasts or sun/moon phases for your boat's location.
- Logbook Printer. For those who still want a paper version of the logbook on board or as backup.

# Emergency

The smartphone app is your always up-to date logbook. Easy to refer to in an emergency and redundancy can be had via other smartphones or the website ashore. Furthermore, with the press of a button, a VHF pan-pan or Mayday radio script is displayed. Information such as position, call sign and MMSI numbers are automatically filled in. Anybody will be able to read off the screen and get a perfect radio message across!

#### **▶** The Website

When creating your own yacht site you get a unique site for your boat. The content is highly configurable from currently 21 Data Panes that provide various information and functionality. The layout and looks is flexible at your own hand. You may even use your own URL (www.MyBoat-Name.com) if you have one. Examples of Data Panes are log books, photo albums, blogs,



and much more. Each Data Pane can be configured to suit your needs. It can also be moved around, added or removed at will.

# Internet Connectivity

The smartphone apps, GPS loggers or Boat Supervisor record all information and stores it in the device. As soon as they get connected to the internet, the information is backed up to the website and stored there. For long ocean crossing trips satellite loggers like SPOT and deLorme InReach are easily sending the information in real time to the logbook for all ashore to follow the journey.


